SPECIAL LECTURE ON NATURAL RESOURCES ECONOMICS IIIA

Social Movements and the U.S. Agri-Food System

by Prof. PATRICK MOONEY

(University of Kentucky, USA)

The course will be centered around introducing historical mobilizations oriented toward the food and agricultural systems in the U.S. from a broad social movements perspective. I expect that this will provide some interesting insights for Japanese students into aspects of American history that might not be familiar. The course will address the history of agrarian mobilizations in the U.S. with a view to a sociological recognition of continuities between episodes of mobilization that tend to elude economic and historical accounts.



Dr. Patrick Mooney is Professor of Sociology at University of Kentucky. His research has primarily been in rural sociology with emphases on rural class structure, social movements, and cooperatives. This research focuses on social change, often from the perspective of political economy. More recently, he is conducting research on issues associated with food security.

He has also published in numerous journals, including *Rural Sociology* and the interdisciplinary *Handbook of Rural Studies* for Sage Publications (London).
