Justice and Tyranny: Mobilizing Rural Sociological Imaginations

(University of Kentucky, USA)

This course aims to introduce students theoretical and methodological tools of rural sociology to unpack the mechanisms of tyranny in three areas: (a) agriculture and food systems, (b) environment and natural resource management in the rural area, and (c) rural community development. Through the assigned readings and seminar discussions, students will investigate many factors behind greater polarization and inequality. Examples will be mainly drawn from the US. But, students are expected to contribute to the seminar by identifying and presenting their own case studies.
