Rural Sociology:

Rural Areas in a Globalizing World

by **Prof. Dr. Claudia Neu** (University of Göttingen, Germany)



As an introduction to rural sociology, this course is designed to give an overview of the sociological concepts of "rurality", "demographic change", "socioeconomic developments and social problems in rural areas", "repeasantization", etc. We will discuss gender inequality, the future of rural landscape and societies. Lectures outline each of these issues and position them within the context of sociology. We will use seminars to debate key questions raised during lectures and to discuss selected issues based on academic publications.

Prof. Dr. Claudia Neu is Professor of Rural Sociology at the Department of Agricultural Economics and Rural Development, the University of Göttingen, Germany. Her research and teaching interests cover demographic change, sociology of public services, rural sociology and civic participation/volunteering.
